# Inside HyperFont

**HyperFont** is designed to **automatically digitize lettering** for embroidery. HyperFont has a **Wizard** that walks you through a step-by-step process for creating an **automatic** embroidery design. In this segment, each step and process will be defined.

## Open Wizard



You must launch the Software (see section called "How to Open FUTURA) to use the HyperFont wizard.

| Step | Action   | Result  |
|------|--|---|
| >1   | Select <b>HyperFont...</b> from the Create drop-down menu. | HyperFont Wizard/Introduction page will open. |
| >2   | Click <b>Next</b> .  |   |

### >1: Enter Text

This is the step for typing in the lettering for embroidery and selecting a font style.

#### Enter Text

| Step | Action                            | Result |
|------|-----------------------------------|--------|
| >1   | Type <b>Text</b> in the Text box. |        |

#### Select Font

| Step | Action   | Result   |
|------|--|--|
| >1   | Click <b>Select</b> in the <b>Select (Font)</b> box. | A list of fonts from <b>Windows Fonts</b> will open. |
| >2   | Choose a <b>Font</b> from the list.                  |  |
| >3   | Click <b>OK</b> .                                    |  |
| >4   | Click <b>Next</b> .                                  |  |

**>2: Embroidery Settings**

In the 2<sup>nd</sup> step the Wizard is offering the option of two types of filling of the text. **“Fill Stitch”** - has only one stitch angle. This is a good choice for **large lettering**. **“Column Stitch”** is like “traditional lettering” with the columns filled with satin stitches.

| Step | Action                     | Result                             |
|------|----------------------------|------------------------------------|
| >1   | Check <b>Fill Stitch</b> . |                                    |
|      | <b>or</b>                  |                                    |
| >2   | Click <b>Next</b> .        | Text will be filled with stitches. |

*It is suggested when embroidering small letters that the needle thread tension be reduced.*

*It is always a good idea to sew a test sample on a swatch of fabric similar to that of the final project.*
